#### Words confused and misused (5)

#### **Disinterested – Uninterested**

Disinterested is often misused for uninterested, which means merely lacking in interest. Disinterested means freedom from bias or prejudice, freedom from personal or selfish motives. A judge must be disinterested in a case, but he should not be uninterested.

#### **Distinctively – Distinctly**

These adjectives are related but not interchangeable. Distinctively means marked, characterized, or differentiated in a special manner, as "That is a distinctively modern idiom." Distinctly means plainly, clearly, and precisely, as "Everyone in the room could hear the speaker distinctly."

#### Due To - Because Of

"He walks slowly due to lameness." This sentence contains an erroneous use of due to. "His slowness is due to lameness" is correct. Many writers and critics prefer an adverbial construction such as "He walks slowly

of lameness." The illogical construction "The reason is due to" as in of "The reason I am late is due to the rain", should be replaced with "The reason I am late is that it rained" or "My lateness is due to the rain" or "I am late on account of the rain."

#### Economic - Economical

These adjectives are no longer interchangeable. The first refers to the science of economics and the second to the economy in the sense of thrift and saving. Examples - "economic questions" and "economic policy", "economical management," "economical buying," and "economical persons."

#### Efficient – Effective

An efficient person or machine is one that performs useful activity in such a way as to get a high ratio of result to expenditure. An effective person or machine is one that can and does produce an effect or a result. A person may be effective in bringing about a certain result without being efficient in doing so.

#### Audit Sampling (No more talk on theory lets talk practical)

Feb 05 2009, morning 10.30 am. NCRCL<sup>®</sup> Chennai called for an in-house seminar on XBRL. Here I am not going to talk about XBRL, I am just recalling a quote from the introduction slide:

"It is always easy to find a right solution for a right question, but it is difficult to frame a right question."

Yes it is true. If I am able to recall right, it was mid June 2005. I joined NCRCL® Chennai as a Consultant Trainee. R S Murali asked us a question on Audit Sampling.

That question was, can you find Audit Sample from a population in the following manner?

Population	Sample	The question seemed interesting. I went home thinking, how do I build this? How to build an equation? How to arrive at a formula?

To build the formula, we need to build a test sample first, and there is a module built in-house in NCRCL® to find out not only the sample size but also the voucher numbers for audit.

The required parameters are as follows:

- 1. Type of voucher (e.g Cash Receipt, Cash Payment, Bank Receipt, Bank Payment, Journal Voucher etc.)
- 2. Population size of each category of voucher
- Starting serial number of each voucher
- 4. Ending serial number of each voucher
- Total value of the vouchers
- Minimum value among each category of vouchers
- 7. Maximum value among each category of vouchers

All the above parameters are to be filled in the Audit Sampling Module.

This results in giving out the number of vouchers and the voucher numbers for audit.

It is a complete MS-Excel based module to find out the sample size and list of vouchers with their voucher numbers for audit.

Certain points to remember:

- 1. The amount of risk the auditor is going to take has to be defined
- 2. All voucher numbers are arrived at based on random numbers.
- 3. The auditor has to apply his knowledge of the client's business, his experience, skill and care for doing the audit.
- 4. This is just a concept and not fool proof.

I am leaving the concept for the readers to take it further. Based on readers' response, the complete module and the formula will be taken up for discussion.
